

## **AUTHORISATION OF TEACHERS OF SPECIAL RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (SRE) 2008**

I am writing to seek your assurance that your organisation currently has in place processes that satisfy the requirements for SRE outlined below.

The Commission for Children and Young people Act, 1998, includes all religious persuasions approved to conduct or seeking to conduct SRE in government schools.

The Act requires a person whose duties primarily involve direct and unsupervised contact with children and young people to sign a Prohibited Employment Declaration. In signing the declaration, the teacher of SRE is indicating that he or she is not a person prohibited from applying for or remaining in child-related employment based on a criminal history. This requirement is to be complied with by every teacher of SRE.

The Department of Education and Training's requirement goes beyond these statutory requirements. An approved religious persuasion must not authorise, as a teacher of SRE, any person who has not signed a Prohibited Employment Declaration or who has a criminal conviction for:

- a crime against a minor
- violence
- assault or
- providing prohibited drugs.

Your religious persuasion must have in place a process to screen teachers so that no teacher is authorised who is unable to meet the above conditions.

In addition to these requirements, approved providers of SRE are reminded of the benefits of providing child protection training to existing and newly authorised teachers of SRE.

SRE teachers employed by a separate Board to implement combined arrangements for SRE must be authorised by all participating persuasions. Such Boards are not approved providers of SRE. Approved providers of SRE are also reminded of the requirements for cross authorisation of teachers acting on behalf of a number of religious persuasions.
